SAT & SUN 6th & 7th February 2021

Don't miss this PIARC SuperSprint on the 4.45km Phillip Island Grand Prix Circuit.

Note: PIARC are trying to provide you with “access to motorsport” by scheduling this event in these uncertain times.

If the event is Cancelled/Postponed due to government regulations, we will give competitors a full refund of entry fees paid.

The Event will be run in two parts:

Saturday

Has been allotted as a circuit familiarisation/practice day, where Competitors may go out and learn the Circuit on their own. Advisors will be available to discuss any questions you may have. Competitors will be allowed a substantial time on the track (We would expect approximately 1 hour of track time in the form of a number of 15-20 minute sessions). The Entry Fee for Saturday is \$250 (**Entries before 01/02/21 \$225.00**).

This Day will include racing for Vic Superkarts.

Sunday

Will comprise of competition runs, each session will consist of one standing lap and four individually timed flying laps. Competitors will get as many runs as can be fitted in on the day (Typically four or five runs). All flying laps will be timed. The Entry Fee for Sunday is \$280 (**Entries before 01/02/21 will be discounted to \$255.00**).

Dorian Timers will be required for all entries at this Event – they can be hired for \$15.

NOTE: Both days are 95dB(A) Full Race noise allowed days.

GENERAL SUPPLEMENTARY REGULATIONS

AUTHORITY:

The Event will be held under the FIA International Sporting Code including Appendices and the National Competition Rules (NCR) of Motorsport Australia, Speed Event Standing Regulations, This Event will be conducted under and in accordance with any and all necessary Motorsport Australia COVID-19 Return to Race strategy requirements, these Regulations and any Further Regulations or instructions that may be issued.

NOTE: This Event is closed to the public, only persons directly associated to the Event will be admitted - Spectators will not be admitted to the venue.

INVITED CLUBS:

One Hundred and Twenty entries plus emergencies will be accepted, financial members of all clubs affiliated with Motorsport Australia are eligible to enter. Current Motorsport Australia Level 2S Licence or superior, Competition Record and a current Club Membership card must be presented via email to the secretary. If entries are in excess of this number then entries will be selected in order of receipt.

TIMING:

Electronic timing will be used for this Event. Timing will be by Dorian Timers. Each Driver must have a Dorian Timer; these are available for hire at the Event and will be charged with your entry.

Hire fee will be \$15.00.

If you own your own Dorian Timer and would like to use it please let us know on the Entry Form, we need your Dorian number. Please charge it before arrival at the Circuit on Sunday.

RESULTS & AWARDS:

Provisional results will be published on Natsoft Website. These results will become final 72 hours after posted. Trophies will be awarded to the driver setting the fastest single, flying lap, in each class upon request by that driver. The Chief Timekeeper is deemed Judge of Fact.

INSURANCE:

Certain public, property, professional indemnity and personal accident insurance is provided by motorsport Australia in relation to the event. Further details can be found in the Motorsport Australia Insurance Handbook, available at (www.motorsport.org.au)

NOISE:

This is a 95dB(A) day. Race meeting noise is permitted.

Times gained whilst over the noise limit will not be counted.

SATURDAY EVENT DETAILS:

Saturday will be a Circuit familiarisation /driver training day. This will be open to members of any club affiliated with Motorsport Australia. Verbal Advice will be available to those requiring it on the day.

The Entry Fee for Saturday is \$250 (**Discounted entries before 01/02/21 \$225.00**) Vehicle and Driver requirements as set out also apply to this day. Entries must be made via the Motorsport Australia Member Event Entry System (www.motorsport.org.au), or on the official Entry Form, and must be accompanied by the relevant fee. **Entries using the Entry Form must be emailed to sprint.secretary@piarc.com.au**

It is anticipated that each participant will spend approximately 1 hour on the track during the day.

Sessions will comprise of groups of up to 26 cars, grouped with vehicles of similar performance and estimated lap times. **There will be no timing. Saturday** and it is a 95dB(A) day. Full race event noise is permitted. Entries open on publication of these Regulations and close at end of business on the 3rd February 2021.

This Day will include racing for Vic Superkarts.

SUNDAY EVENT DETAILS

Entries open on publication of these Regulations The Entry Fee for Sunday is \$280 (**Entries before 01/02/21 will be discounted to \$255.00**). Entries must be made via the Motorsport Australia Member Event Entry System (www.motorsport.org.au), or on the official Entry Form, and must be accompanied by the relevant fee. **Entries using the Entry Form must be emailed to sprint.secretary@piarc.com.au**

Sunday's Event will be a **Multi-Club Supersprint**, which will consist of a number of multiple start flying laps for all Competitors/Drivers. All heats will be at the Phillip Island Grand Prix Circuit on Sunday 7th February 2021. Entries open on publication of these Regulations and close at end of business on the 3rd February 2021.

Dorian Timers will be required for all entries at this Event.

The Organising committee reserve the right to refuse any entry in accordance with NCR 33.

AUTOMOBILE REQUIREMENTS:

Competing cars are required to comply with Schedule A & Schedule B of the current Motorsport Australia Manual. The minimum requirements for road cars include:

Cars must be in a presentable and roadworthy condition.

Minimum of a lap sash

Fire extinguisher firmly fixed in car while competing. Fire Extinguisher comply with Schedule H of the current Motorsport Australia Manual. NOTE: BCF/Halon extinguishers are illegal.

- Fuel must be in accordance with Schedule G of the current Motorsport Australia Manual.

DRIVERS REQUIREMENTS:

While competing in Sprint and Familiarisation, all Drivers must wear a helmet to a standard listed under Schedule D in the current Motorsport Australia Manual, and clothing that will protect the skin from flame from neck to wrist to ankles (i.e. long woollen jumper, long trousers or slacks, suitable shoes and socks.).

SCRUTINY:

You will be required to fill in a Self Scrutiny Checklist and forward to the Event Secretary these will be checked off by the chief scrutineer. Cars damaged during the Event must be returned to Scrutiny for inspection prior to continuing. Cars considered unsafe, or unsuitable, will be precluded from further competition. (Scrutineering may change due to Covid-19 requirements)

PROTESTS:

Any protests must be in accordance with Part XII of the NCR.

ABANDONMENT:

The Director reserves the right to postpone, abandon or cancel the Event, if in his opinion the number of entries is insufficient or by "force majeure" in accordance with the NCR 11.

Classes A, B, C & D are for road-registered cars using generally road-going equipment only.

All cars using racing tyres, or slicks, will be classified as Modified, as will be excessively modified road cars. The organisers reserve the right to re-classify cars, following vehicle scrutiny. For full details of modifications allowed in each class see Group 5 Speed Event regulations, on www.piarc.com.au The organisers reserve the right to amalgamate classes if in their opinion entries are insufficient to warrant a separate class

EXCLUSION:

The Stewards may exclude from further participation or impose another penalty on any Driver who:

- after leaving the Circuit, re-joins the track in a manner or at a speed considered dangerous to themselves, to any other Competitor, or to an Official;
- disobeys the direction of an Official;
- exceeds 10 kph in the Paddock Area;
- ignoring a black or mechanical problem flag
- passing whilst under a yellow or red flag
- For multiple car events - drives in a manner considered dangerous to other participants or whose vehicle comes into contact with another vehicle, or in such a way that a faster car is prevented from passing.
- is deemed to be under the influence of alcohol or drugs, penalties for breaches of these Regulations will be as listed herein or as for breaches of other relevant regulations.

ALCOHOL, DRUGS AND OTHER SUBSTANCES

Any holder of a Motorsport Australia 'Competition' or 'Officials' licence (or equivalent licence issued by another ASN) may be tested for the presence of drugs (or other banned substances) and subject to a penalty(ies) for a breach in accordance with the Motorsport Australia Anti-Doping Policy and/or the Motorsport Australia Illicit Drugs in Sport (Safety Testing) Policy as published on the Motorsport Australia website. Consumption of alcohol in the paddock, pits or any section of the competition venue/course under the control of the Officials is forbidden until all competition is concluded each day. Accordingly, any holder of a Motorsport Australia 'Competition' or 'Officials' licence (or equivalent licence issued by another ASN) may also be tested for the presence of alcohol by a Motorsport Australia Accredited Testing Official (CATO) in accordance with the Motorsport Australia Standard Operating Procedure for Breath Alcohol Testing.

RISK WARNING AND ASSUMPTION OF RISK

Motorsport Activities are inherently dangerous recreational activities and there is significant risk of injury, disability or death. If you do not wish to be exposed to such risks, then you should not participate in the Motorsport Activities.

I acknowledge that the risks associated with attending or participating in Motorsport Activities include but are **NOT LIMITED** to the risk that I may suffer harm as a result of:

- motor vehicles (or parts of them) colliding with other motor vehicles or persons or property.
- other participants acting dangerously or with lack of skills.
- high levels of noise exposure.
- acts of violence and other harmful acts (whether intentional or inadvertent) committed by persons attending or participating in the event; and
- the failure or unsuitability of facilities (including grand-stands, fences and guard rails) to ensure my safety.

EXCLUSION OF LIABILITY, RELEASE & INDEMNITY

In exchange for being able to attend or participate in the Motorsport Activities, I agree:

- to **release** Motorsport Australia and the Entities to the extent that any or all of them are providing Recreational Services from all liability for:
 - my **death**.
 - any **physical or mental injury** (including the aggravation, acceleration or recurrence of such an injury);
 - the contraction, aggravation or acceleration of a **disease**.
 - the coming into existence, the aggravation, acceleration or recurrence of any other **condition, circumstance, occurrence, activity, form of behaviour, course of conduct or state of affairs**:
 - that is or may be harmful or disadvantageous to me or the community; or
 - that may result in harm or disadvantage to me or the community,howsoever arising from my participation in or attendance at the Motorsport Activities.
- to **indemnify and hold harmless and keep indemnified** Motorsport Australia and the Entities to the maximum extent permitted by law in respect of any Claim by any person; and
- to attend at or participate in the Motorsport Activities at my own risk.

I understand that:

- nothing in this document excludes, restricts or modifies any rights that I may have as a result of significant personal injury that is caused by the Reckless Conduct of Motorsport Australia and the Entities as the supplier of the Motorsport Activities and Recreational Services;
- nothing in this document prevents Motorsport Australia and the Entities from relying on any laws (including statute and common law) that limit or preclude their liability.
- nothing in this document excludes any term or guarantee which under statute cannot be excluded, however the liability of Motorsport Australia and the Entities is limited to the minimum liability allowable by law.
- nothing in this document precludes me from making a claim under a Motorsport Australia insurance policy where I am expressly entitled to make a claim under that insurance policy; and
- Motorsport Australia has arranged for limited personal injury insurance coverage which may provide me with some protection for loss, damage, or injury that I may suffer during my participation in the Motorsport Activities. I acknowledge and accept that the insurance taken out by Motorsport Australia may not provide me with full indemnity for loss, damage or injury that I may suffer during my participation in the Motorsport Activities, and that I may have to pay the excess if a Claim is made under an insurance policy on my behalf. I agree that my own insurance arrangements are ultimately my responsibility and I will arrange any additional coverage at my expense after taking into account Motorsport Australia's insurance arrangements, this document and my own circumstances.

Where Motorsport Activities are held in the following jurisdictions, I acknowledge that I have also read and accept the following warnings:

Under the Australian Government Consumer Law (which is part of the Competition and Consumer Act 2010 (Commonwealth)), several guarantees are implied into contracts for the supply of certain goods and services. You agree that the application of all or any of the provisions of Subdivision B of Division 1 of Part 3-2 of the Australian Consumer Law (i.e. guarantees relating to the supply of services), the exercise of rights conferred by those provisions, and an liability of Motorsport Australia and the Entities for a failure to comply with any such guarantees, are excluded. Under section 22 of the **Australian Consumer Law and Fair-Trading Act 2012 (Vic)**, the supplier is entitled to ask you to agree that these conditions do not apply to you. Excluding, Restricting or Modifying Your Rights:

Under section 42 of the **Fair Trading Act 1987 (SA)**, the supplier of recreational services is entitled to ask you to agree to exclude, restrict or modify his or her liability for any personal injury suffered by you or another person for whom or on whose behalf you are acquiring the services (a third party consumer). If you sign this form, you will be agreeing to exclude, restrict or modify the supplier's liability with the result that compensation may not be payable if you or the third-party consumer suffer personal injury.

Important:

You do not have to agree to exclude, restrict or modify your rights by signing this form. The supplier may refuse to provide you with the services if you do not agree to exclude, restrict or modify your rights by signing this form. Even if you sign this form, you may still have further legal rights against the supplier. A child under the age of 18 cannot legally agree to exclude, restrict or modify his or her rights. A parent or guardian of a child who acquires recreational services for the child cannot legally agree to exclude, restrict or modify the child's rights.

Agreement to exclude, restrict or modify your rights:

I agree that the liability of Motorsport Australia and the Entities for any personal injury that may result from the supply of the recreational services that may be suffered by me (or a person for whom or on whose behalf I am acquiring the services) is excluded.

DEFINITIONS

- a. "Claim" means and includes any action, suit, proceeding, claim, demand or cause of action however arising including but not limited to negligence, BUT does NOT include a claim under a Motorsport Australia insurance policy by any person expressly entitled to make a claim under that insurance policy;
- b. "Entities" means event and competition organisers/promoters/managers, land and track owners/managers/administrators/lessees, Motorsport Australia affiliated clubs, state and territory governments and insureds listed in Motorsport Australia's public/product/professional indemnity insurance policies and each of their related bodies corporate (including their related bodies corporate) and each of their organs and agencies, officers/president/directors/executives, employees, servants, agents, partners, providers, members, competitors, drivers, co-drivers, navigators, officials, crew members, pit crew, delegates, licence holders, representatives, commissions, committees, advisers, trustees, councils, panels, shareholders, volunteers, officials, appointees, delegated bodies and sponsors;
- c. "Motorsport Activities" means any motorsport activities or Recreational Services which are permitted or approved which Motorsport Australia regulates or administers or otherwise are under the responsibility / control of Motorsport Australia.
- d. "Motorsport Australia" means the Confederation of Australia Motor Sport Ltd. trading as Motorsport Australia.
- e. "Reckless Conduct" means conduct where the supplier of the recreational services is aware, or should reasonably have been aware, of a significant risk that the conduct could result in personal injury to another person and engages in the conduct despite the risk and without adequate justification;
- f. "Recreational Services" means (unless otherwise defined in this document) services that consist of participation in:
 - a. a sporting activity; or
 - b. a similar leisure time pursuit or any other activity that:
 - i. involves a significant degree of physical exertion or physical risk; and
 - ii. is undertaken for the purposes of recreation, enjoyment or leisure.

COVID-19 DECLARATION

I declare that I:

- have not been diagnosed with COVID-19 as confirmed with a positive test for COVID-19 (not antibody test);
- am not currently experiencing any symptoms of COVID-19;
- have not been in contact with a known COVID-19 positive case in the previous 14 days; and
